ACCESSIBILITY GUIDE

01 Accessible Parking

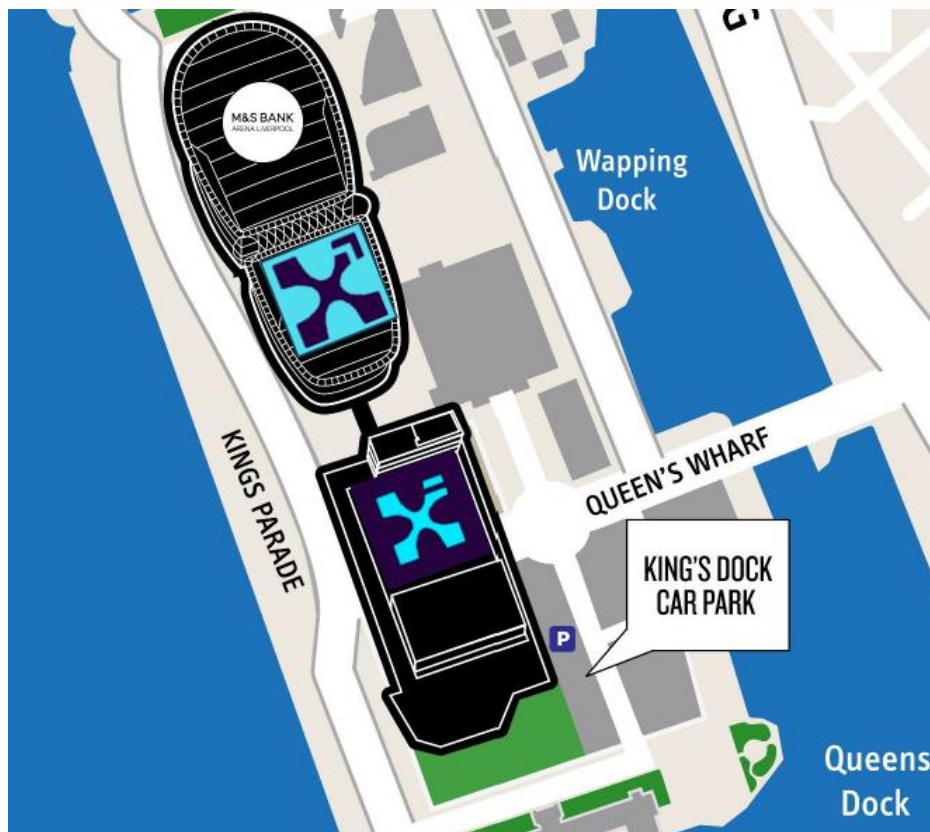
Visitors driving to the Liverpool Experience Campus will find accessible parking available in the adjacent Kings Dock Car Park. There are 88 accessible spaces spread over 7 floors for the ease of visitors.

Lifts in the car park feature a mirror to aid reversing out of the lift and have both visual and audible floor indicators. Stairwells are clearly marked and have handrails on both sides.

The route from the car park to the entrance of the Exhibition Centre is accessible for wheelchair users, although assistance may be required for Convention Centre as the route does include some ramps.

Visitors may also be dropped off on the river side of the building at our designated “Drop Off Point” for coaches and taxis. There is a ramped access to the Riverside entrance doors.

Designated cycle bays can be found at our Riverside Entrance (road level)



02 Venue Access

The campus is fully accessible via access ramps from the city centre, car park and taxi drop off point. All steps have designated support railing for assistance.

Convention Centre

The main entrance level for the Convention Centre is the galleria, with two entrance points, one on the cityside and another on the river side. Both entrances have automatic double entrance doors which are permanently staffed when an event is taking place. The Galleria flooring is slate.

Guest Experience is situated on the galleria, which is the main reception point for the building and an information point for visitors providing local information, taxi bookings and recommendations on things to do and see in the city. The 1207 Coffee Shop is also located on the galleria next to the cloakroom.

There are two lifts available from the Galleria to both the upper and lower levels. Each lift has an accessible width of 1300mm and visual and audible floor indicators. There are also escalators which can be used to access the other levels. Stewards are situated at both escalators to assist delegates.

The conference rooms are situated on the upper level where stewards are available to assist disabled delegates. The conference level lighting is ambient and appropriate for wayfinding whilst not being sensory heavy and there are contrasting colours to assist with navigation. Both the conference level and lower levels are carpeted.

In Hall 1 (main auditorium tiered seating) there are 12 designated spaces for wheelchair users and assistants. These spaces can be used for assistance dogs. Hall 1 is also accessible on two different levels with the lower of the two levels providing access to the main stage. The designated spaces offer clear sight lines of any performance.

Exhibition Centre

The main entrance for Exhibition Centre is via the atrium main entrance. This entrance also has automatic double entrance doors which are permanently staffed when an event is taking place. The atrium flooring is also slate.

The Guest Experience team is situated on the ground floor within the atrium which is the main reception point for the building and an information point for visitors providing local information, taxi bookings and recommendations on things to do and see in the city.

The 1207 Deli is also located on the atrium level of Exhibition Centre, as is the cloakroom.

Exhibition Centre meeting rooms are situated on Level 1 where stewards are available to assist visitors. The meeting room level lighting is ambient and appropriate for wayfinding whilst not being sensory heavy, there are contrasting colours to assist with navigation. Level 1 is carpeted throughout.

The main Hall in Exhibition Centre is fully accessible with accessible facilities.

03 Hearing Assistance

Both Convention Centre and Exhibition Centre feature an infra-red assisted listening service, which is available in specific seating areas of each venue.

A personal neck loop can be collected from a member of LEX staff or at the Guest Experience desk. Please enquire for more details if you require this service. In the case of an emergency, trained stewards will assist any delegates with a hearing impediment to evacuate the building.

04 Sensory assistance

Liverpool Experience Campus is committed to providing an inclusive and welcoming environment for all visitors. Our staff are trained to assist delegates with sensory needs and hidden disabilities and are available throughout the campus to provide support where required.

We are proud participants in the Hidden Disabilities Sunflower Scheme. Delegates wearing a Sunflower lanyard can be identified by our staff as someone who may require additional assistance, patience or understanding during their visit.

Quiet spaces are available across the campus for delegates who may need time away from busy event environments. If you require access to a quiet area, please speak to a member of staff who will be happy to assist.

Delegates who may benefit from taking a break during an event are welcome to enter and leave the building as required. We encourage visitors with specific sensory requirements to contact us in advance of their visit or speak to the Guest Experience team on arrival so that we can help make their experience as comfortable as possible.

05 Assistance Dogs

The Liverpool Experience Campus welcomes delegates with assistance dogs. Please ensure that your assistance dog is clearly identifiable when entering the building to ensure that our Stewards are aware of their presence. Facilities for assistance dogs are available on request.

06 Toilets

Convention Centre

Conference Level - 2 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilet – toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Stage Level - 2 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilet – toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Mezzanine Level - 2 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilets– toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Both have baby changing units.

Lower Level - 2 Separate Disabled Toilets one for Ladies and one for Gents – toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Exhibition Centre

Atrium Level - 3 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilet – toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Main Exhibition Hall - 3 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilet – toilet, dryer and soap dispenser.

Level One - 2 Separate Unisex Disabled Toilets– toilet, dryer soap dispenser.

Both have baby changing units

Accessible facilities are also available in each of the organiser suites within Exhibition Centre.

A fully accessible changing places is available on site. The Changing Places Toilet facilities include:

- A height adjustable adult-sized changing bench
- A tracking hoist system
- Adequate space in the changing area for the disabled person and up to two carers
- A centrally placed toilet with room either side
- A screen or curtain to allow some privacy
- Wide tear off paper roll to cover the bench
- A large waste bin for disposable pads
- A non-slip floor

Please note, our staff are unable to assist with the Changing Places toilet.

07 Cloakrooms

There are cloakrooms in both the Convention Centre and Exhibition Centre. For the Convention Centre the cloakroom is situated on the Galleria level, with a low desk for easy access. The cloakroom is staffed throughout the open periods of conference. For Exhibition Centre, the cloakroom is situated on the atrium with low level desk for easy access. The cloakroom is staffed throughout the open periods of an event.

08 First Aid

Should first aid assistance be required please contact a member of the venue team. For the Convention Centre the two first aid rooms are located on the Arena side of the building and stewards will be able to escort you to these rooms. For Exhibition Centre, the first aid room is located on the atrium and stewards will be able to escort you there. Alternatively, first aid assistance can be called to your location in the building.
